QnA Cosmetic Surgery Scar Revision Informed Consent

Scar revision, by definition, is revising an area which has not healed optimally and has left an undesirable, visible scar on the skin. In attempting to change the appearance of this area, the surgeon will, by necessity, leave another scar. Every effort will be made by the physician and staff to insure that a positive outcome with noticeable improvement in the treated area is accomplished and that this resultant scar will be more acceptable in appearance to the patient. It is acknowledged by the patient's signature below that such a revision may result in no improvement in the area, and, in fact, may be judged to look worse than the original scar. This risk is understood and accepted.

Unexpected complications may include but are not limited to infection, bleeding, bruising, pain, and scarring.

I have read the above information, and all of my questions have been answered to my satisfaction. No guarantee concerning the outcome of the surgery site has been made to me, and I agree to follow all post-treatment instructions.
